



**FORT WORTH GOLF
AMERICANS WITH DISABILITY ACT (ADA)
GOLF COURSE ACCESS POLICY**

It is the policy of Fort Worth Golf to provide access to golfers with disabilities in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Persons who qualify as a person with a disability under the ADA may be given golf cart access to certain areas otherwise restricted and only accessible by persons walking on all three City of Fort Worth Golf Courses, including Meadowbrook, Pecan Valley, and Rockwood Park, in full compliance with the ADA.

Cart access may be denied to areas where safety is a concern or where the agronomic integrity of the golf course is threatened based upon a finding by the Director or Superintendent and provided in writing, posted prominently in the clubhouse for the affected course, and the affected areas. Also, from time to time, the Director or his or her designee may impose temporary restrictions for safety reasons or as necessary for the maintenance for any of the three courses. Such maintenance includes but is not limited to re-seeding or repair of damage, including damage resulting from flooding.

Because occasionally courses may experience inclement weather and conditions without warning, golfers requesting special golf cart access pursuant to this policy will be required to register in the pro shops where they are playing prior to beginning play. Notice of any changes in the course may be given out at that time along with a special pass to be displayed in plain sight on the cart in which the golfer is riding.

Players who seek ADA accommodations at any City of Fort Worth golf course must make a request prior to their round of play and provide documentation of their need for accommodation, such as a state-issued ADA placard

Players granted ADA access will be given a flag or other sign identifying their cart as ADA accessible. ADA Access signage must be displayed at all times during the round.

Players granted ADA access will be informed of all rules and any safety exceptions for that day. Players will also be informed of any other naturally sensitive areas with limited or no access.

Four Levels of Play will be identified:

During Normal Conditions of Play, players who have been provided ADA access to Fort Worth Golf Courses may enter sensitive areas, including tee boxes and greens, with a properly identified golf cart.

During Cart Path Only Conditions of Play, players who have been provided ADA access to Fort Worth Golf Courses and are utilizing a properly identified golf cart may enter fairways but must do so at a ninety-degree angle unless the layout of the hole prevents such practice.

During Extreme Conditions of Play, player safety or golf course agronomic integrity prohibits any users from entering certain areas. In these conditions, all players will be prohibited from entering identified areas. The prohibited areas will be clearly identified in writing in the pro shop. All players granted ADA access prior to their round will be informed of the affected areas.

During Course Closure Conditions, the golf course has been deemed unplayable by the Director or Superintendent, and all play is prohibited.

If two players in the same group request and are granted ADA access, they will be asked to use the same cart.

Players riding with persons granted ADA access but who do not themselves require and have not been granted ADA access must abide by all standard golf course rules when playing their ball.

Any player not abiding by the accepted procedures and golf course rules will be asked to remedy the situation immediately. In severe cases, or when players refuse to remedy the situation, players may be asked to stop their round and leave the premises.
